# Modern Day Miracles—Made Possible by You

Eight-year-old Shaun\* was flunking out of his special education classes at school - mainly because he rarely attended. He needed, but was not receiving, routine medical care. He had never learned simple skills like how to tie his shoes or make a bed. The only food he would eat was rice. He often tussled with other kids, and when he grew frustrated in class, he cursed at his teachers.

Social workers brought him to live at Epworth. Although an older sibling was already living here, Shaun was upset at being moved from his home. But as Epworth cottage coordinators, tutors and counselors began working one-on-one with him, Shaun lowered his guard. Staff began seeing his many admirable qualities. For instance, after he was shown how to organize his schoolwork, he incorporated the practices enthusiastically. When his house parents made it clear that cursing wasn't acceptable, he stopped the behavior and began speaking in a respectful manner to both adults and classmates. Staff recognized that Shaun displayed natural athletic ability and a passion for sports, and most of all, showed a high level of intelligence.

Epworth tutors worked with Shaun to help him catch up in school. He did so well, school officials soon transitioned him to regular academic classes. He has made As and Bs ever since. His cottage coordinator arranged for him to play in a community

football league and later, a basketball league. Staff taught him simple skills that his peers had learned at a much earlier age. They introduced him to a variety of new foods. He made friends.

In June, Shaun graduated from the fifth grade and was awarded 'Most Improved Student'. He says he wants to attend college one day. He spent part of his summer at a sports camp, and his housemates elected him to the Epworth Aim Higher Council. Everyone who knows Shaun sees his miraculous turnaround and exciting potential to live a fulfilling, productive life.
